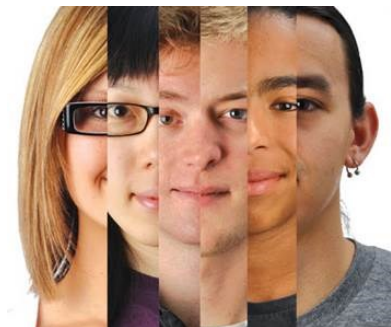


Impact of Domestic Violence on Healthcare

- Annually, women experience 2 million injuries from intimate partner violence (IPV). ¹
- The cost of IPV exceeds \$5.8 billion each year, \$4.1 billion for direct medical and mental health care services. ²
- 324,000 pregnant women each year are battered by their intimate partners. ³
- 75% of injuries are to the head, neck, or mouth, areas routinely assessed by dental health professionals. ⁴
- 81% of women and 35% of men who experienced IPV reported at least one health-related impact. ⁵
- In four different studies, 70 -81% of abuse survivors reported that they would like their healthcare providers to ask them privately about intimate partner violence. ⁶

The Medical Advocacy Program (MAP)
